This is why I am so glad that you are resisting the misguided tax harmonization initiatives of the European Union and Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. The United States is the world's biggest beneficiary of "tax competition," and it would make no sense to support "information exchange" or other harmonization initiatives that would hinder the flow of capital to the U.S. economy or give foreign governments the power to tax income earned in America.

International bureaucracies have no right to meddle in the domestic policies of sovereign jurisdictions. If some high-tax governments are upset that jobs and capital are migrating to countries with more attractive tax and privacy laws, they should enact market-based reforms, not seek to create what has been referred to as a "global network of tax police."
